Mark Sandvigen currently serves as the Secretary, Webmaster, Newsletter Editor, and Legislative Chair of the Coastal Carolina Chapter of MOAA (CCMOAA). The Coastal Carolina Chapter hosts nine counties and officers from all the services supported MOAA.

Mark grew up in Oregon and left home at the age of 17 to enlist in the US Coast Guard. He served as a Hospital Corpsman at US Naval Hospitals and on USCG cutters and air stations. Upon discharge in 1976, he enrolled in Pre-Med at Southern Oregon University. Upon graduation, he decided against a medical career, and was commissioned as a Surface Warfare Officer in the US Navy in 1980. While at sea, he served in combat systems billets on destroyers, cruisers, and amphibious ships. His shore tours were highlighted by appointments as a "subject matter expert" to major naval staffs in Europe and the United States. Additionally, while ashore, he was assigned to educational institutions where he earned Master of Science degrees in Space Systems Operations, Information Systems, and Business Administration.

He retired as a senior executive in 2016 and moved to New Bern after a lifetime of PCS moves and business relocations.
